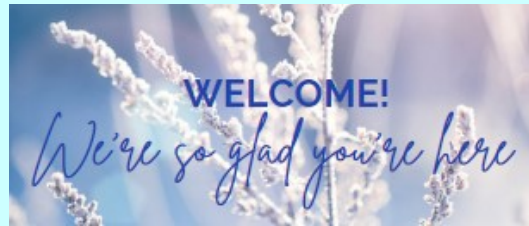

Presented by Dominish Miller of Preserving the History of Newberrytown/Lewisberry History Lovers Group

"Your Backyard Geology"

Jeri Jones, of Jones Geological Services in Spring Grove, will present a program "Your Backyard Geology" at 12:30 p.m. on **Thursday, January 11, 2024.**

His PowerPoint presentation will discuss the area's geology including the rocks, fossils and minerals in the area. Did you know that some of the first dinosaur foot tracks found in the Mid-Atlantic region were found in Midway? More dino tracks were discovered near Yocumtown. Find out how fern fossils found near York Haven tell us that northern York County was once an "Everglades" in the geologic past. Find out what type of rock the famous York Haven Hydroelectric Plant foundation is composed of and where it came from. For minerals, garnet is found here although none of it is of gem quality.

The program will conclude leaving you in awe that area residents were very close to growing up in Morocco and not in Pennsylvania.

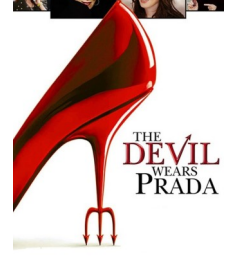
