

Red Land Senior Center Partial Opening Protocols

- Drive-thru, takeout meals will continue; no on-site congregate meal service. Pick up remains 12-12:30.
- Pre-registration of programming required and numbers will be limited. Members are only permitted in the building for the duration of registered programs and must leave at the conclusion. All doors will remain locked up until 15 minutes before the program begins.
- Drop-in socialization permitted in the pavilion only.
- Chairs and tables for programming will be set up in advance.
- Members are asked to use the same seat for the duration of their stay and to disinfect their table/chair area before leaving (disinfecting wipes provided).
- Virtual programming continues in addition to in-person programs.
- Member Entry Procedure
 - Members must stay home if they are sick.
 - Members who have underlying health conditions are encouraged to consult with their healthcare provider before attending; those conditions may include, but may not be limited to chronic lung disease, asthma, heart conditions, diabetes, immunocompromised as a result of cancer treatments, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, HIV or AIDS, or medications causing immune weakening.
 - All members will be temperature checked and complete a verbal health assessment. Those who test 100° (or higher) or exhibit symptoms including fever, cough, runny nose, eye irritation, or skin rash will be sent home. Those who have been driven by a friend or family member should ask their driver to stay until their temperature check and health assessment is completed.
 - Sign-ins completed by staff.
 - Members must wear masks covering nose and mouth. If they do not have, masks will be provided upon entry.
 - No communal snacks/coffee/tea/water provided. Each person may bring 1 bottled beverage and one snack. No sharing of snacks or beverages permitted. No snack/beverage donations accepted.
 - Cleaning/paper donations may be accepted with prior approval and must be placed on what is traditionally known as the sign-in table. Donations may not be brought into the kitchen.
 - Personal items (i.e. coats, purses, bags, etc.) must be either hanged on the hallway coat rack or kept with the individual. The side table will no longer be available.
 - Entry/exit limited to lunch room doors. Front doors will remain locked. Members are not permitted to re-enter after exiting.
- Staff
 - Masks and gloves required throughout food prep and distribution.
 - Senior volunteers permitted as scheduled.
 - All staff and volunteers temperature checked upon entry. Those registering 100° or higher will be sent home.
- Building open areas – lunch room, narthex, restrooms.
 - Dining room will have no more than 16 people at one time.
 - Narthex will have no more than 4 people at one time.
 - Restroom will have no more than 2 people at one time. Lysol provided in each stall and must be sprayed by individual after use. Everyone must wash hands after using the restroom.
 - Closed areas – all classrooms and thrift shop. No members permitted in reception office, staff office, and kitchen, only staff and scheduled volunteers. Signs are prominently posted on all closed areas.
 - Minimum of 2 hand sanitizers available in all open areas.
 - Tables and chairs may only be moved by staff.
 - Members are encouraged to participate in re-opening orientation to be apprised of new safety and procedural protocols.
